LOCATION AND PARKING

The Museum is located at <u>300 N Houston Street</u>, <u>Dallas 75202</u>, with a gateless, covered parking garage conveniently situated across the street at 301 N. Houston.

- After you enter, please scan the QR code in the garage with your cell phone's camera to pay. Or you can use the ParkMobile app.
- To fill out the form, you will need to enter your license plate number.
- If you have questions or need assistance, please take note of your license plate number and a staff member inside the Museum can help you.

- All Day (valid 12 hours) \$12
- Early Bird (in by 9:00 a.m., out by 5:00 p.m.) \$8
- Evening (after 5:00 p.m.) \$8
